Celebrating 140 years of ministry

During worship this past Sunday, a verse from the hymn we were singing stuck with me.

We are a temple, the Spirit's dwelling place

Born in great weakness, a cup to hold God's grace

We die alone, for on its own each ember loses fire

Yet joined in one its flame burns on to give warmth and light and to inspire.

(Bryan Jeffery Leech, "We Are God's People" Covenant Hymnal #600)

The last two lines provide a gripping image: a fire burns throughout the night, and as time passes the various embers spread out and begin to smolder. Small corners of red coals slowly cool. This is not the end of the fire, however, as Someone comes along and pushes the isolated embers together. Feeding off one another, the embers build heat, reignite and build back into a roaring fire.

In this season of cool nights, hot cider and burning campfires, the illustration reminds us of the importance of community. Alone we struggle, falter and have difficulty holding on. Together we support, grow and build life.

This past spring our church wrote a why statement describing the church in its best self. In it we highlight "welcoming community" as a core value of our church. At its best, our church community has felt like the warmth and light of a roaring fire as people come together to support one another. How appropriate that a scenic campfire area sits on our church property! (If you haven't seen it, the path to the outdoor chapel runs off the back of the church parking lot).

This welcome differentiates our community from corners of our fractured world which are based on divisions and "sides". Apart, they are like smoldering embers. Perhaps a welcoming community can help us all learn to live with one another. It doesn't define itself by who is "not us" and who is "other" but seeks to welcome in others and show them God's love. "How good it is", the Psalmist writes, "when brothers and sisters live together in unity!" (Psalm 133). It is a fire which can inspire the world around us.

I join with all of you in deep prayers for our country this coming month. It seems few people hear and see one another and fewer are trying to live in a community of love. We are lonely embers. It will be good for us to vote and pray-but perhaps as Christians we should not be surprised by the deadlock, dead ends and deep division. We serve a God who is the Prince of Peace and who brought his own welcoming community-the Kingdom of God. This is the example and power which can change the world.

As our hymn says at another point:

He wills us be a family diverse yet truly one.

Oh, let us give our gifts to God

and so shall his work on earth be done.

May God bless our country in this important season. May God's kingdom come quickly. And, as we wait, may we be a fire to give light and life and to inspire.

Now you can choose the weeks that work for your group. You can have one person sign-up for all the spots or have members sign-up for each individual spot. Please add your ministry name in the comments.


Celebrating special occasions
